Fire and Rescue Operations Highlights

- Captain Kocokinski, Administrators Hampton and Glenn, along with Trustee Anderson and fire administration continue to meet with architects and contractors for the remodel at Stations 51 and 53.
- Fire Chief Ziehr attended the Spencer Township Trustee's monthly meeting to give a report in person. Chief Ziehr highlighted the run volume for Spencer Township, ongoing training, and the remodel for Station 56 that began in March.
- Battalion Chief Born continues to work on the Firefighter Memorial project at Station 52. Chief Born has met with many local businesses continuing to gather ideas and donations for this project.
- Fire administration applied for a grant through Fire House Subs. This funding would be used for a turnout gear washer and dryer.

Public Relations Events

- Battalion Chief Born leads the hiring committee and set up a static recruitment display at the Lucas County Department of Workplace Development Youth Hiring Event hosted at the Glass City Center. This annual event hosts hundreds of graduating seniors who are entering the workforce.

Training

- Extensive, hands-on, vehicle extrication training was held throughout the entire month of April. Lead trainers include Firefighters Przeniczny and Baney. A huge thank you goes out to the team at Bubba's Towing for hosting and assisting us in this extensive training. The training involving vehicle, camper, and semi rescue scenarios for over eighty members. Appreciation was expressed to Bubba's Towing and owner Tim Bond for providing vehicles, setup assistance, and support at no cost to the township. Trustees and administration commended the realistic training and community partnership. Discussion also included exploring a potential vehicle donation program that would allow residents to donate unwanted vehicles for training purposes while receiving a tax benefit.



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
